

Background	After leaving university I spent 30 years teaching in an inner-city school in Salford. This required me to be a form tutor responsible for the pastoral care of my form, as well as a subject teacher. I later became assistant head of Year 7, managing the transition from primary to secondary school. I was also Head of Religious Education, Personal and Social Education and careers, and taught child development to GCSE level. After 30 years I took early retirement from teaching in 2008.  I immediately took up a new challenge, becoming a business officer at English Heritage, later Historic England, in their Manchester office. I dealt with the awarding of grants to listed buildings for repair work and planning and listed building consent applications from local authorities in the northwest. I became the assistant business manager, a role which required me to deepen my understanding of financial matters, manage staff, challenge decisions without being confrontational and mitigate risk. I retired from this role in 2019.  I hope the skills I have developed throughout my working life will allow me to make a positive contribution to Delamere School.
