 - ▶ The Progression Steps covers a wide ability range and is designed for primary age.
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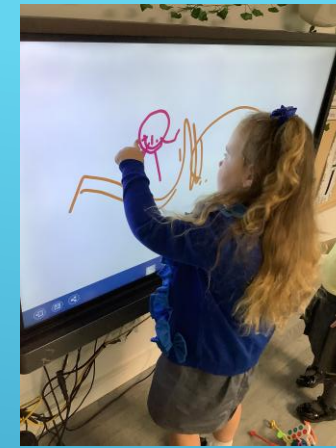
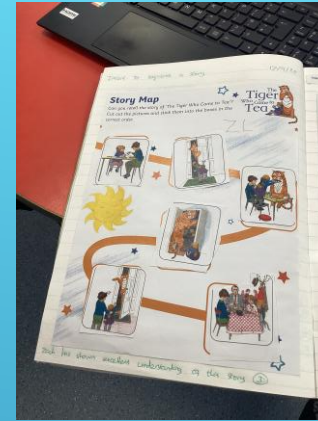
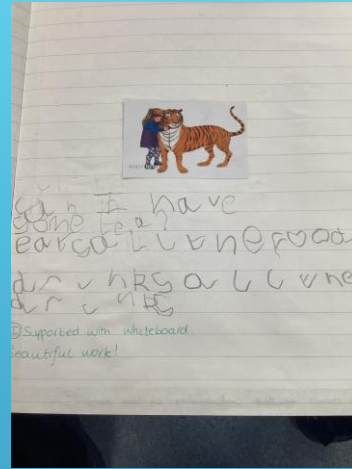
WHAT WILL IT LOOK LIKE?

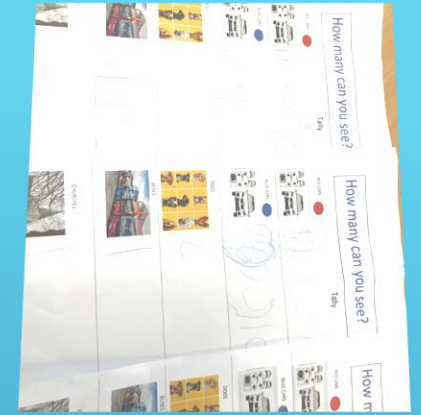
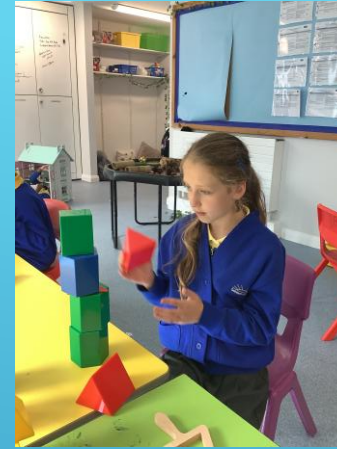
